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1. **You can take it up to 12 times.** I bet you didn't know that. Most students take it one time – and their done. The key to mastering the ACT is: Take it early and often. The ACT college board allows students to take the ACT up to 12 times. Research has proven that, with preparation, you will increase your score if you take it multiple times. So, go for it!

2. **Learn the scoring table.** Only 1% of students and parents REALLY know how the numbers work. You would be amazed how easy it is to conquer this exam if you really knew how many questions you needed to answer correctly in each section to get the score you want. Our training course will teach you that.

3. **The English Test reviews grammar rules taught in Elementary and Middle School.** This is a little known fact. The reason ACT English scores are so low is that grammar generally is not taught or reinforced in high school. So, students are left to recall what they learned in middle and elementary school. All the grammar rules are reviewed in the ExamExperts ACT Preparation Course.

4. **Memorize The Math Formulas.** There are over 42 algebraic and geometric math formulas that students should memorize to prepare for the ACT Math Test. However, many students sit for the exam with only a cursory understanding of these formulas. As a result, this greatly affects the student's math scores. Our course focuses on formula memorization.

5. **Early Preparation is the Key To Higher Scores.** At ExamExperts, we begin ACT preparation at 7th grade. Why? Just doing practice questions won't increase your scores. Repetition is valid, but more is required to excel on the ACT. There must be ample time spent reviewing substantive concepts, comprehension techniques, discussion of explanations, and memorization of formulas.

The "Why" is more important than the "What". On the ACT, learning cannot take place until the 'Why' question has been answered. Students must know why the answer they chose was incorrect, and 'Why' the best answer listed is the BEST answer. This is a major factor in increasing your ACT score.

8.

Science is: Reading Comprehension and Mathematics. The key to conquering the Science section is to remember that the key skills being tested are reading comprehension (analyzing the facts) and mathematics (analyzing the graphs/experiments and drawing reasonable conclusions). Learn more!

The difference between a 21 and a 28 in Reading is 7 questions. Hard to believe? As you examine the ACT scoring table, you will see that the Reading Test is the test where the greatest gains can be attained with the least amount of questions. A 21 (top 50% score) in reading can be attained by choosing 23 answers correct. However, a 28 (top 10% score) can be attained by choosing 30 answers correct. That's just two more answers correct in each passage. Think you can achieve that? Of course you can! You will learn more about this in the ExamExperts Course!

Think Big. Start looking at your ability to succeed on this test from a different perspective. For instance, see yourself with a perfect 36 when you begin this exam.
